

As we look back at 2020, Sterling Health Care has a lot to celebrate even in the midst of the COVID-19 Pandemic. Prior to March we expanded our pharmacy staff, hired a full-time transportation driver and began offering x-ray services in

We were fortunate in our innovation efforts that we had already began testing the Telehealth platform and after our community shut down due to COVID we were able to roll out the technology and offer virtual visits to those who still needed care and did not want to come into the office setting. Senator Mitch McConnell visited the organization in July and commended the leadership on seeking the additional funds to help during the year to maintain staff and ensure that services remained available to the communities that Sterling Health serves. The Paycheck Protection Loan and COVID related funds from HRSA were crucial to sustainability.

We have continued to grow and evolve as an innovative organization while staying true to our mission to improve the lives for all people in the communities we serve, regardless of their ability to pay. All services of the organization have been extremely needed by the patients this year and the Community Health Workers and Outreach and Enrollment were very busy helping patients navigate.

In looking forward to next year, continued growth in School Based Health, the building and development of new buildings in Carlisle and Mt. Sterling to combine 3 sites, and expansion into Powell County are on the horizon. Our continued willingness to innovate and expand will help us embrace the future of healthcare while providing quality care and compassion to each and every patient we serve.

This year, we added 32 supportive, dedicated people to our growing team.










Visits by Service Type (percentages)














Colorectal Cancer Screenings




Controlling High Blood Pressure

2020 Achievements


- Over 19,000 patients were served.
- X-ray services were implemented at SHC-Owingsville.
- Virtual visit services were rolled out, with great success.
- Pandemic relief grants were received and utilized so that patient care was uninterrupted during the COVID crisis.
- Women's Care services were expanded to Winchester with the opening of Sterling Women's Care – Winchester.
- Tina Bryant became Sterling Health Care's interim Chief Executive Officer. Ms. Bryant was later named as the permanent CEO, in December.
- SHC Urgent Treatment Center opened and became Sterling Health Care's primary COVID testing facility.
- The 'Sunshine Room' was started, through which SHC patients in need can get food, clothing, household, and personal items.
- Collaboration continues with community partners, to help address issues such as food insecurity, transportation, and substance use disorders and more
- A Quality Metrics Award was received and Sterling Health Care was ranked among the top 30% of Health Centers nationwide, for best overall clinical performance.
- The School-Based Health Center program was expanded to include Bourbon and Powell Counties
- Sterling Health Care staff was some of the first in the area to receive their first COVID vaccine.



Two of our four primary care facilities are recognized as Patient Centered Medical Homes by the National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) because of the ongoing quality care they provide.

2021 Goals

- PCMH recognition will be sought for SHC-Carlisle and SHC-Stanton.
- Construction will begin on our expanded Mt Sterling campus, that will house all primary care and behavioral health in Mount Sterling.
- Construction will also begin on the new building for SHC-Carlisle.
- Primary care and behavioral health services will expand into Powell County.
- Pharmacy services will be implemented at SHC Owingsville.
- Over 120,000 visits will be provided.
- Over 25,000 individual patients will be served.
- Sterling Health Care will continue to partner with local health care organizations to provide health care education to the communities we serve.


PATIENT'S LIFE-SAVING **MEDICINE PROVIDED BY OUR PHARMACY**

Sterling Health Care employee Iennifer Hager was in need of a critical medication for her daughter.

In October 2020, Jennifer Hager's daughter, Emilee, became very ill. Of course, during a pandemic, the family's first thought was that Emilee had COVID. After several negative tests and worsening symptoms, Jennifer took Emilee to the Emergency Room. There they found that Emilee had an illness that needed a very specific medication for treatment. The hospital did not carry the medicine and the ER physician was afraid that Jennifer would not be able to find it anywhere.

When calling the local pharmacies, Jennifer found that the medication that Emilee needed would cost nearly \$6000.00. Jennifer was willing to do anything to make her daughter feel better, even if it meant spending that much money, and placed a call to one more pharmacy - Sterling Health Pharmacy. Not only did Sterling Health Pharmacy have this rare medication in stock, but Jennifer also discovered that they gualified for the 340B program and were able to get the medication for only \$1.20!



FAMILY GETS ENROLLMENT **HELP JUST IN TIME**

Adrian Perez needed a high level of care that came at a high cost; but, luckily his family had been enrolled in a Medicaid program just days beforehand.

In late December 2020, SHC Community Health Worker, Pastora Back, received a panicked call from Adrian Perez' mother. Adrian, who was nine years old, was having severe leg pain and was inconsolable. Pastora arranged for Adrian to be transported to the local Emergency Room, where he was transferred to a children's hospital and admitted with hip pain and a fever. Adrian had been involved in a scooter accident a few days prior, on Christmas Day, but did not think he was badly injured at the time. An infection had developed in his hip in the days since the accident, however, and he was now in need of critical care.

Two days prior to Pastora receiving the call from Adrian's mother, she had interpreted for the family during their visit to a Sterling Health Care clinic. During that visit, Pastora learned that the family did not have health insurance. Pastora immediately involved SHC Outreach and Enrollment Specialist, Jennifer Trimble, who was able to enroll the family in Presumptive, or temporary, Medicaid. The quick and thorough work of Pastora and Jennifer, helped Adrian get the help he needed for his illness and without the family having to worry about affording the high cost his care, thanks to their new insurance.



Providing New Location Plus More Services for Women's Care

Sterling Health Care is proud to expand its services to areas where they are most needed. In June 2020, we opened Sterling Women's Care – Winchester, located next to Clark Regional Medical Center, in Winchester, Kentucky. The facility combined two practices that were both loved by the community but that were also both closing. With the closing of the former practices, the women of Clark County would have had to travel outside of their area for care.

Also added in June 2020, were Certified Nurse Midwives to both of our Women's Care locations, as well as onsite Substance Use Disorder Treatment for Obstetric patients. Through these new services, we are able to better assist women in their child-bearing years. "The addition of midwifery care to our services give women the power and knowledge to focus on the natural experience of pregnancy and childbirth rather than just the medical aspect. Statistically speaking midwives play an instrumental role in reducing the rates of preterm birth, medical interventions, cesarean birth, regional anesthesia, as well as delivery costs."



Urgent Treatment Center Opens

In July 2020, we opened Sterling Health Care – Urgent Treatment Center, in Mount Sterling, Kentucky. Through this facility, patients, whether they are existing SHC patients or not, can walk in for treatment of urgent ailments and non-lifethreatening injuries, and receive all of Sterling Health Care's unique benefits, such as financial assistance, transportation services, and integrated mental health.

SHC-UTC has also been established as our primary COVID-19 testing site. While testing is available at our other sites, at UTC, patients can be tested without leaving their vehicle.



Expanding our School-Based Health Center Services

In the Fall of 2020, we expanded our School-Based Health Center services into Bourbon County Schools (Paris, Kentucky) and Powell County Schools (Stanton, Kentucky). And, although the school year looked and felt a little different due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we have been able to successfully launch both of these programs and care for hundreds more students!

The Sterling Health Care School-Based Health Centers provide care to students, during the school day, at their school. Students can be seen for routine immunizations and well visits to sick visits and sports physicals, all without interruption to their school day or their parents' workday. "Our goal for School Based Health is to ensure students have access to high quality healthcare when and where they need it. We are excited to now offer this service to Powell and Bourbon Counties. Even through the struggles of a pandemic and an unpredictable school year, our teams have adapted to provide meaningful access to care through onsite visits, telehealth visits and even curbside visits to anyone needing care."



Administrative Staff worked from home; Clinical Staff donned extra layers of PPE to protect themselves and their patients; and clinic hours changed so we could provide the most care without exposing patients and visitors unnecessarily. Sterling Health Care followed strict well and sick patient protocols at every facility and the 'Temp Takers' were onboarded to greet every visitor to a SHC facility with a friendly smile, a brief COVID screening and temperature check. More than ever, our duty of keeping our patients and staff safe was front and foremost, amidst a disease the world was just getting to know.

Virtual Visits, Testing Sites, and Vaccinations Among Accomplishments

Along with the response, came the effects, as well, however. Patient encounters dropped and revenue decreased. Expenses increased due to the purchasing of extra PPE and testing equipment. As a result, expansion and building projects were put on hold and many of our work family was furloughed. Luckily, the US Government answered the call with providing relief funding that kept our doors open so we could continue to provide care for our communities and restore our workforce. Also, donations of PPE were received to help ease unexpected costs, as well. Sterling Health Care and its Community Partners worked together to ensure that no one in our communities experienced a loss of quality healthcare during this time.

A year later, we can look back with a sense of immense accomplishment, as Sterling Health Care survived the year and has nearly fully recovered. Once furloughed staff have returned and projects are once again on the drawing board. We have established a COVID testing center and provided testing for 2761 patients in 2020. Virtual Visits, first introduced in April 2020, have quickly become a very popular offering for our patients. Also, SHC staff were among the first in our communities to become fully vaccinated against the disease. We continue to grow and adapt so we can continue to provide extraordinary care for our communities who need us.


